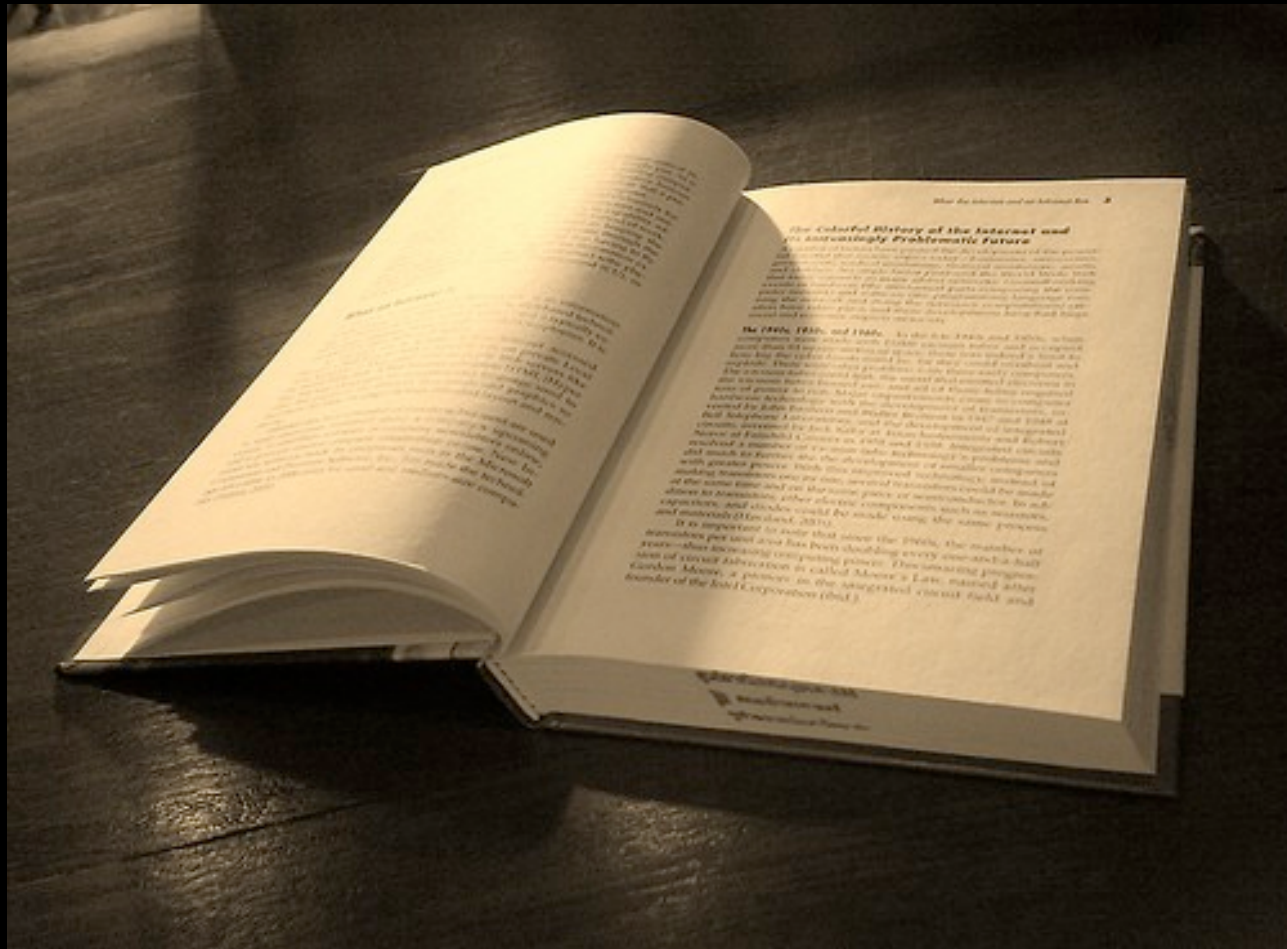


Open Source Software: it rocks!

But the corners are rounded.

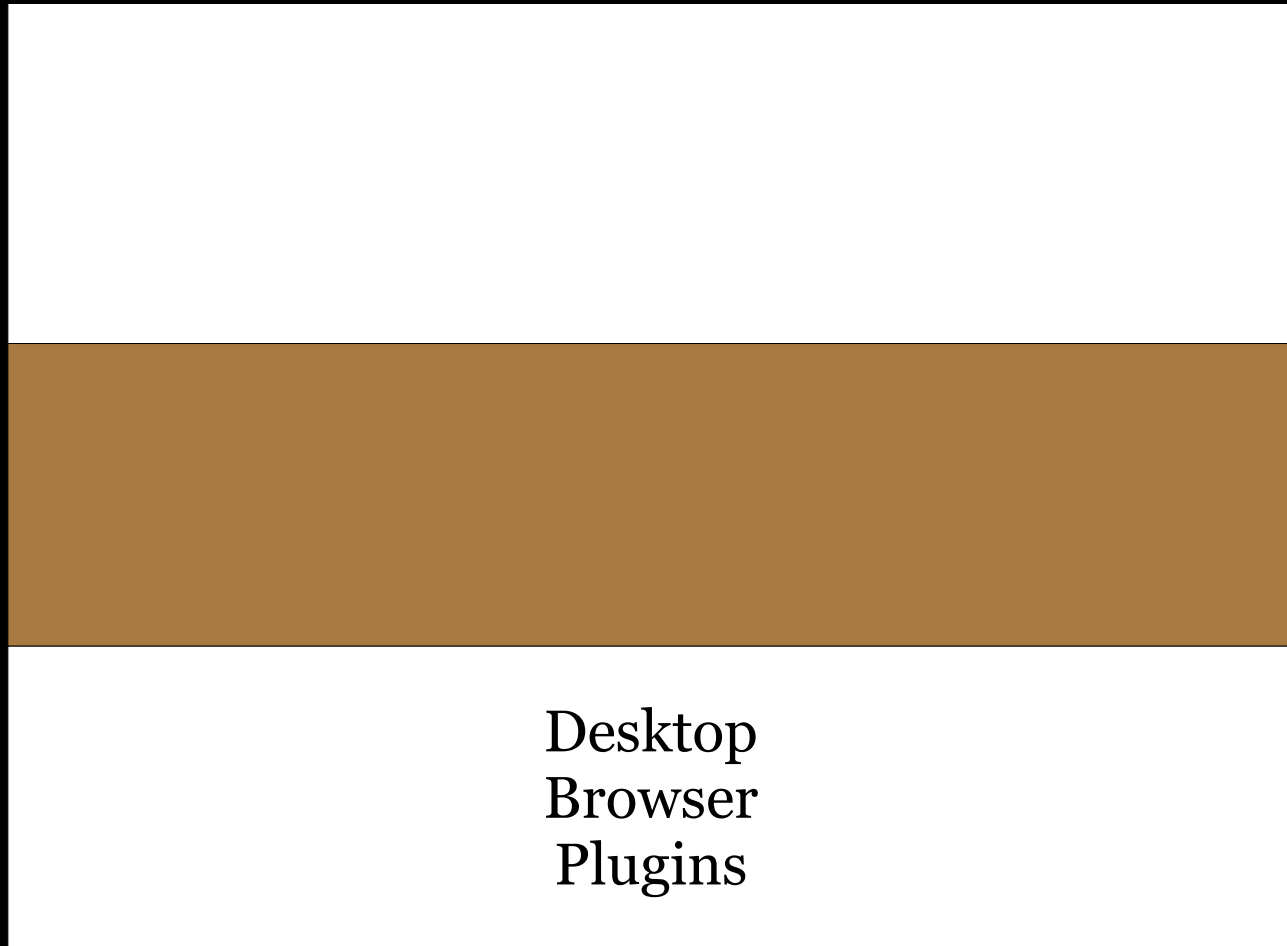
And the mascots are cute.
