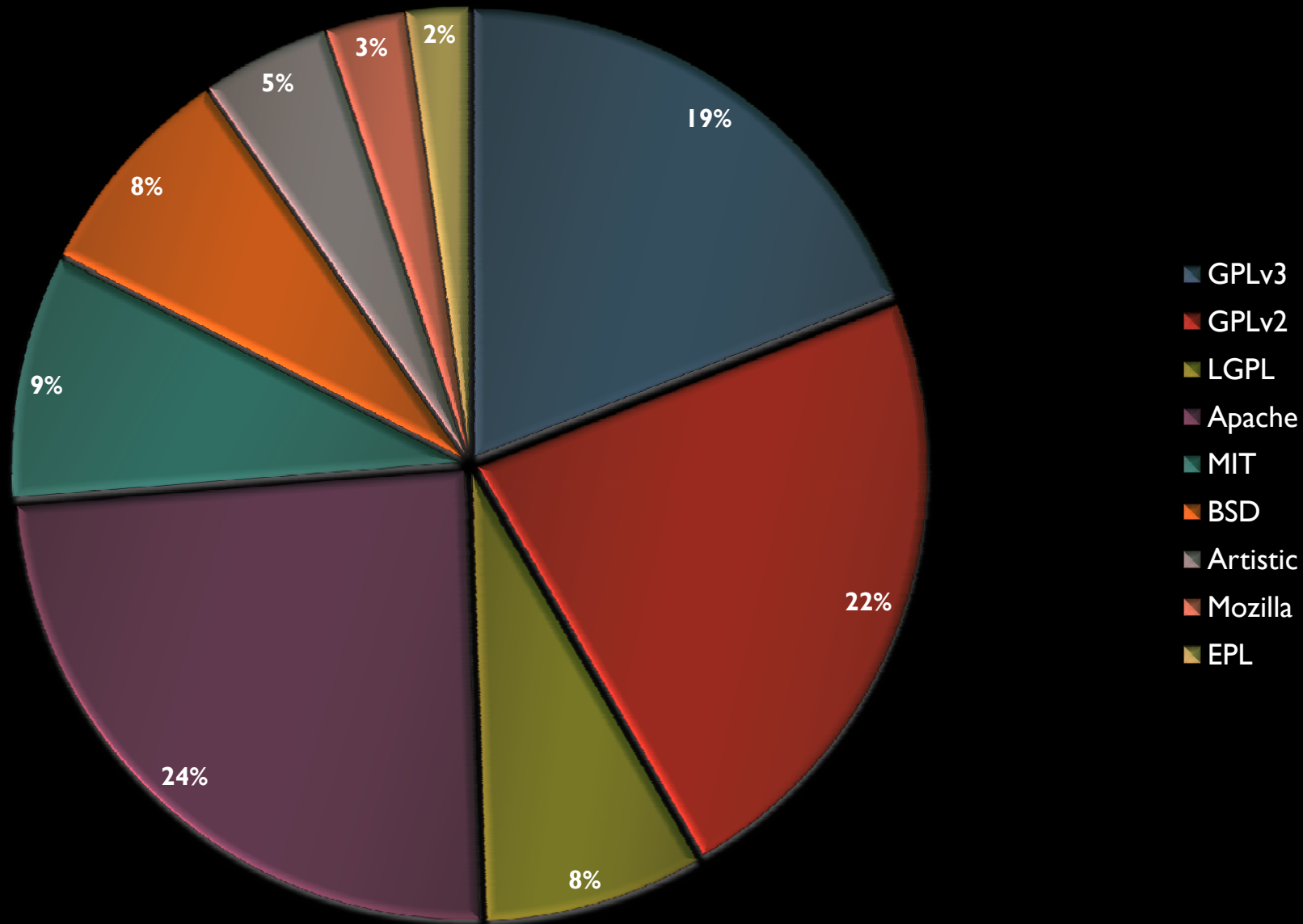

How trustworthy is the Data

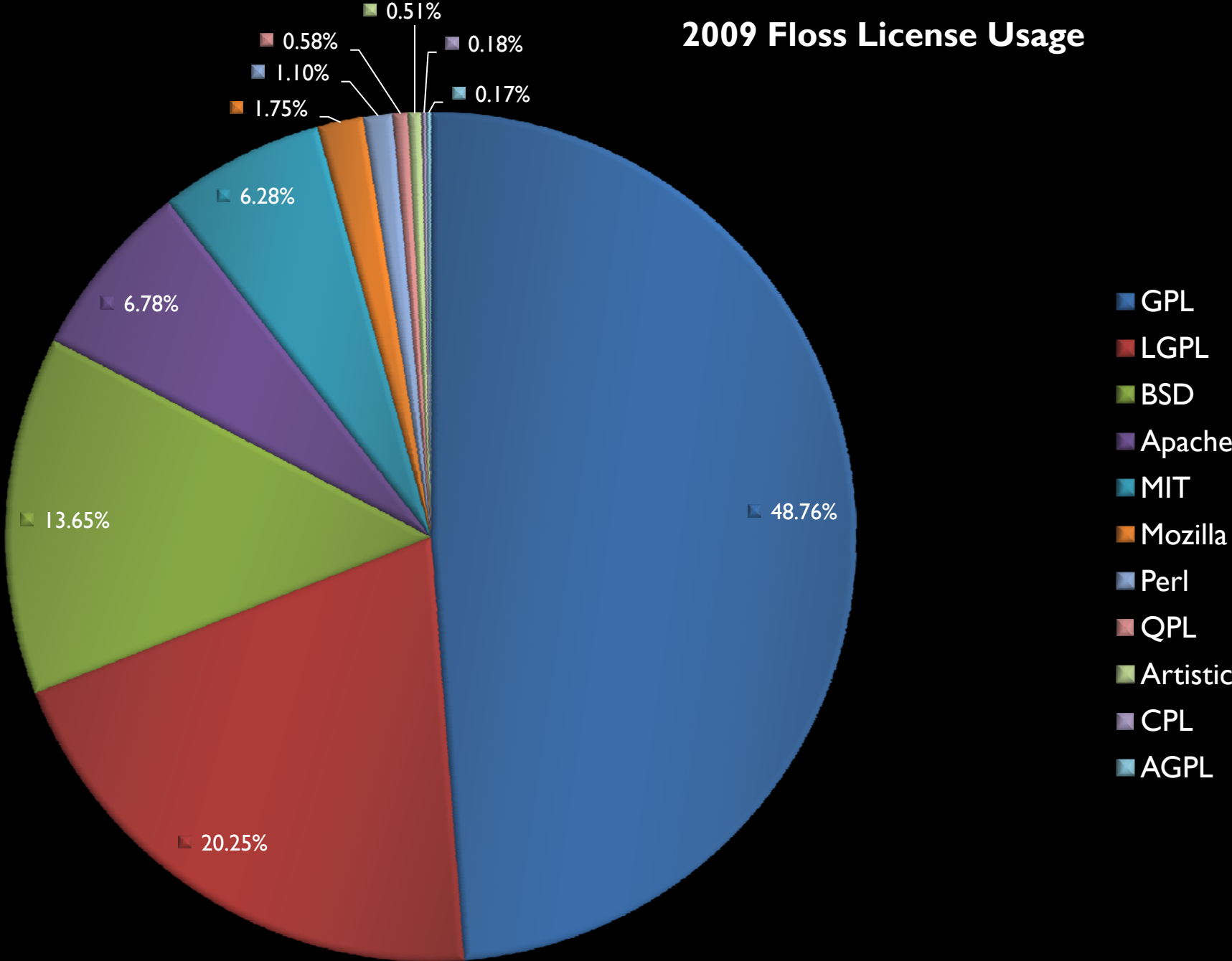
- ▶ Crawl Changes

 - Syncs



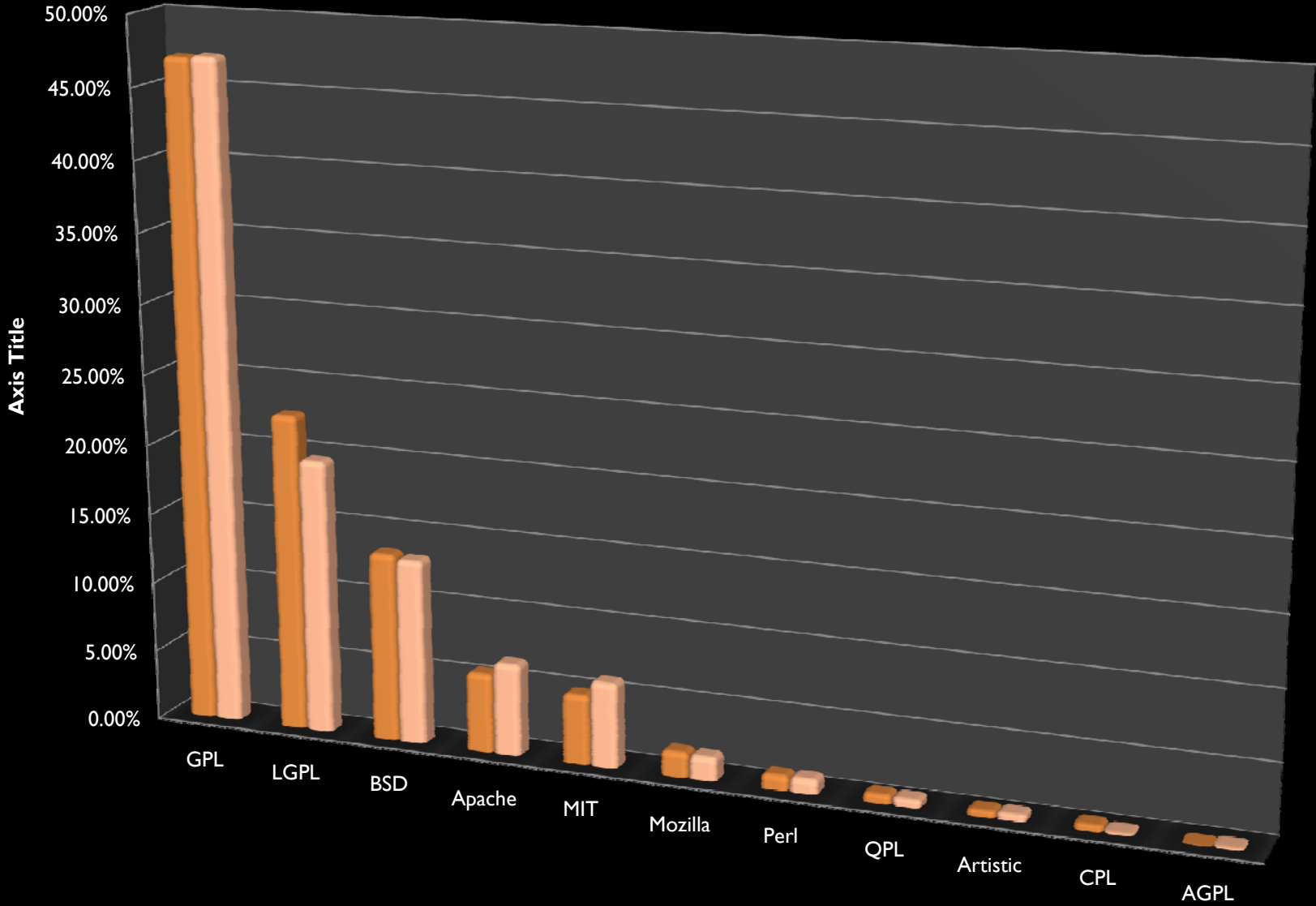
Code.Google.Com license breakdown across ~225k projects
